June Gray A Life Well-Lived

Recently, the Creswick Community lost a well-loved resident. This is a brief, but by no means comprehensive, tribute to this lady.

In 1933 June was born in Creswick, the elder child of parents who lived near where the Ballarat/ Maryborough rail line crosses Gillies Road, Creswick North. A brother followed. Starting school in 1938, she originally rode a horse to North Creswick Primary School where her teacher was Miss Ida Bowley. When her brother started school they graduated to a horse and cart and later, when a bit older road bikes to school. To help the family finances, they often got the job of selling lettuces from their mother's garden on the way to school. After school there were always chores to be done on a mixed farm.

Leaving school after grade 8, June worked at Morleys Knitting Mill in Ballarat and then in Clunes at the Internet Factory. She married Harry in February, 1952 and in 1980 they managed to buy the 19 acre Bald Hills property where she saw out her days. Harry was a seasonal worker who dug potatoes around the Scrub Hill and Dean area. He also worked with the cropping farmers cutting oats and hay then, stooking it.

June and Harry had five children, two sons and three daughters. The older children were home schooled while Harry worked on farms in the Mallee and New South Wales. For weeks on end the family would pack up and go *on the rabbits* in the Mallee, trapping, spotlighting and shooting rabbits, then selling them in Mildura. This served a dual purpose

of feeding the family and creating an income. They also travelled to the Mildura Ice Works and into NSW to sell the rabbits.

Once the older children were ready for high school, Harry worked at Ryall's Mill, in Creswick and June became very involved with Bald Hills School and Tennis Club. She played tennis well into her 80s and this group of ladies continued to meet on a regular basis to have time together for morning tea, a natter and have their hair cut.

June was a founding member of the Creswick Garden Club and later received Life Membership. When the club began in the Church of England Hall, June was in charge of the Show Bench at each monthly meeting of the group. She had a beautiful garden and many interesting old fashioned plants and bulbs and was always willing to share them.

A stalwart of the Creswick Senior Citizens, June particularly enjoyed events involving music, the visits to Morning Melodies and musical events at the Wendouree Performing Arts Centre. Her favourite song, *Love is in the Air*, was played at her funeral. She also loved the bus trips she organised over the years. One person remembers in recent years how if she ran into June on a Friday she was always in a hurry – 'gotta go, the oldies will be wondering where I am if I'm late to pick them up'.

There is no doubt that June lived a selfless life which was anchored not only in her family, but in community service.

Kingston's Ancient Algerian Oak



Kingston's ancient Algerian Oak tree is under threat of being cut down because of *AusNet's* proposed transmission lines. It is a finalist in this year's *National Trust Tree of the Year* contest. The winner will be decided by public vote which runs until midnight on 23 October. If you would like to vote for this tree, google *National Trust 2025 Victorian Tree of the Year*.

The oak can be seen on the right as you cross the bluestone bridge on the way from Kingston to Blampied, or by stopping before the bridge and walking past the pine plantation down the old coach track towards Birchs Creek. It was placed on the Trust's *Register of Significant Trees* in 2023 because of its age, which is at least 130 years old, good health, unmodified state as it has never been pruned and it's cultural and scientific importance. Sadly, being on the *Significant Tree Register* does not give it statutory protection and *AusNet* dismisses its loss as **low impact**.

Kingston residents however, are fighting the decisions to cut it down and to build an 80 metre high tower beside the 1883 keystone-arched bridge. Submissions have been made to *AusNet* and 875 signatures to save the tree were gathered in the three weeks before submissions closed, a Hands-Around-the-Oak Rally was held on 20 August attracting people from all over the region and there has been much media coverage.

People are being urged to vote for Kingston's Oak for two reasons; it is a very worthy contender for the title of *Tree of the Year*, and it is hoped that winning this title will help in the fight to save it from being destroyed and to protect Kingston's only piece of public land along with the historic bridge.

Traffic improvements for Diuwang Baring

Following the successful (and busy) opening of Djuwang Baring last year, Council is acting on community feedback to improve local roads.

We have reaffirmed \$300,000 to complete the Melbourne Road pedestrian crossing (as part of the original scope of the project) and are investing \$300,000 in road upgrades (all from within the original project allocation) including:

- sealing St Georges Lake Road
- realigning the St Georges Lake Road and Lees Street intersection
- installing speed humps and traffic calming infrastructure
- reviewing the speed limit on St Georges Lake Road
- installing new signage to improve safety and access
- trialling a pick-up zone at Hammon Park

We are also applying for funding to expand works and reduce the cost to ratepayers.

In March this year, Trent Ashley, a wig and hair designer with over 30 years of experience in the hair industry, decided that Creswick would be the ideal place to set up shop. He opened *Tamed Studio* in the old Commonwealth Bank building in Albert Street, where he could continue his hairdressing business, as well as making the wigs for which he is now well-known.

Trent's career really took off in 2010, when a lady, whose hair he was cutting, spotted some wigs he was working on for a friend and offered him a job on *Hairspray* in Sydney.

This work led to Singapore to work with *Wicked*, and the rest is history.

His extensive theatre credits now include serving as Head of Department on numerous productions, including *Hairspray* (2010), *Wicked* (Singapore Tour 2011 – 2012), *Moonshadow* (2012), *Georgie Girl* (2015), *Miss Saigon* (2016), *Dusty* (2016), *Funny Girl* (2016), *Curtains* (2016), *Brigadoon* (2017), *Hello Dolly* (2017), *Jesus Christ Superstar* (2017), *Oklahoma* (2018), *The Boy from Oz* (2019), *A Little Night Music* (2019), *Legally Blonde: The Musical* (2019,) and the Victorian State School Spectacular (2019 – 2023).

Last Christmas and New Year, Trent did all the wig maintenance for the Disney cruise ship. His work has

also been featured prominently on RuPaul's *Drag Race*, and in a wide range of television advertisements. Although slowly winding back from full-time wig production, Trent still works on wigs for friends and school productions.

In modern musical theatre, virtually all main actors wear wigs. It saves time and provides continuity of the look. Indeed, most international productions brought into Australia are contractually required to use a specific and exact design for costumes and hair. The process for making a wig - particularly for

theatre - requires a huge amount of skill as well as creativity. To make the wigs, real hair is sourced from overseas, and depending on the complexity of the design, can take from several hours to several days. Once finished, they require constant maintenance.

In July last year, Trent settled on 22 acres north of Creswick, with his partner and his mum. He loves this town, 'It's close to everything, with a beautiful atmosphere and everything you need is right here'. It's clear that Creswick's creative community has also gained another talented member.

100 Years Ago

October 2, 1925 Woodcutters and others are reminded that the annual woodchop for the Creswick District Hospital will be continued on Saturday (tomorrow), at Cobbler's Gully. An attempt will be made to complete the whole of the cutting and stacking, and to do this a big body of workers will be required.

October 6, 1925 Old age and invalid pensions have been increased by 5/ per fortnight, irrespective of existing rates. Pensioners will note that the first payment at the increased rate will be made on Thursday next, 8th October.

October 9, 1925 Steinman's Motor Bus will run to Ballarat on Saturday and Monday evenings, in connection with South Street Competitions. Leave at 7 o'clock.

October 13, 1925...Football - Next Saturday, on the Smeaton ground, Creswick and Bungaree will play for the premiership. In the event of Creswick being beaten, they will, as minor premiers, have the right

to challenge Bungaree to a grand final, which will take place on the latter's ground.

October 16, 1925 At the present time there are 42 subscribers to the Creswick telephone exchange, and the number is to be added to by seven connections for Ascot residents. This will mean the revenue from the local exchange will closely approach, if not exceed, the amount necessary for a continuous service. Those who desire this should bestir themselves to prevail on others to have the telephone installed, so that a continuous service will be assured.

October 20, 1925 The pupils of the local school again demonstrated in a practical manner, their appreciation of the District Hospital, by making a record collection of sixty-seven dozen and three eggs.
