Bringing Musical Joy To Creswick

Lyster's Opera *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, performed to a sell-out audience at Creswick's Town Hall. As the rain rang down on the roof, nothing could drown out the sweet, clear voice of soprano Belinda Dalton. Her superlative singing was much-appreciated by members of the audience, who were heard to remark how fortunate that such a high standard of performance could be seen and heard in a small town like Creswick.

Jamie Moffat, Director of Lyster Opera, said he was delighted that the Creswick and district community were supporting the productions. 'The numbers are growing, and the company loves coming to Creswick where they receive such a warm welcome. Rehearsals are well underway for Christoph Willibald Gluck's Orphée et Eurydice which we will bring to Creswick in March 2026.'

Director of *The Merry Wives*, Daniel Sinfield, in piecing this comic opera together, realised that it was important to make it relatable to current audiences. While the situations described in Shakespeare's original play are recognisable as modern dilemmas - love, jealousy and relationships - Daniel wanted to tease out certain events to show how the characters dealt with their frustrations, making them feel almost contemporary, rather than just figures from a distant time.

Falstaff, the antagonist of the story is a bumbling, self-centred figure who has few redeeming qualities. The role was admirably sung by Darcy Carroll, whose deep bass baritone voice was a joy to hear.

The full cast performed magnificently and the good news is that tickets will be on sale soon for Lyster Opera's next production in March 2026.

Saturday, 18 October, dawned overcast, but by mid-morning the sun was out and so were the buyers at the 10<sup>th</sup> annual Creswick Community Garage Sales (CCGS). Volunteers selling maps at the Creswick Bandstand were kept busy from 8.00am, with many regulars lining up, eager to get to the good stuff ahead of the crowds. Albert Street was a hive of activity as visitors sought coffee and sustenance ahead of the great bargain hunt.

Twenty-four households took part this year, with the regular monthly Creswick Market hosting a further four. Whilst site numbers were down on last year, visitors commented that they found it easier to navigate between fewer locations over a smaller area. Creswick sellers had the option of staying open on Sunday too, with a number reporting better sales on the second day.

Planning is already underway for next year's CCGS with the promise of a redesigned map layout. Although most people manage to find locations using their phones, the listing of map co-ordinates does create confusion for others. It seems the days of drawing lines from X-Y to find your destination are a thing of the past!

Creswick Community Garage Sales are an annual fundraising event for Creswick & District Aquatic Centre Inc (C&DAC). The campaign for an indoor heated swimming facility for this community continues, as it has since 2012. In August 2024, Hepburn Shire Councillors received a presentation on the *Indoor Aquatics Provision Feasibility Study and Business Case* prepared by consultancy Solucio Pty Ltd. The report has yet to be made available to Creswick & District Aquatic Centre Inc. committee or the public.

# **Creswick Capers**

#### Stepping back in time

The school is so fortunate to be located in a town that is steeped in history. The year 5/6 students have been learning about life in Australia in the 1800s and how the Gold Rush impacted the lives of people in the area. This learning has been centred around the Jackie French historical fiction text, *The Night They Stormed Eureka*. The story tells of a group of people on the Goldfields in 1854 and what life was like for them trying to strike it rich.

The learning experiences for these senior students have been varied. They visited the local cemetery, where the graves of the 22 miners lost in the Australasian Mining Disaster in 1882 are located. Students learnt the stories of the mining disaster that happened on our back doorstep. This remains Australia's worst gold mining accident.

Students then experienced life on the Goldfields for

themselves with a two-day camp to the costume schools at Sovereign Hill. Here, they dressed up in authentic costumes while they attended school, learning what it was like for children on the Goldfields. The group also attended the *Aura Night Show* at Sovereign Hill, a spectacular retelling of the Eureka Stockade, a history lesson about how gold made its way into the earth and the discovery of gold through the eyes of the Wadawurrung people.

Prep, 1, 2, 3 and 4 students didn't miss out. They went to Sovereign Hill on one of these days to see the students dressed up and were also involved in educational activities which taught them about what children played and words used in the 1850s.

## 100 Years Ago

#### November 3, 1925

An interesting function was carried out at the local State School in the afternoon of Friday last, when the Memorial Prize – the permanent gift of the executors of the late J. E. Cowling, a former head teacher- was presented to the winner, Mavis B. Grose, grade VI, by Lady Peacock.

#### November 6, 1925

It is regrettable that there was not a larger attendance of parents at the local town hall last Tuesday evening when a grand concert and display were given by St. Peter's Wolf Cubs from Ballarat, in aid of the funds of the Creswick troop of boy scouts.

#### November 10, 1925

The Creswick Football Club had a very successful season, for the team succeeded in carrying off the district premiership. To celebrate that achievement, a grand ball is to be held in the town hall tomorrow (Wednesday) night.

#### November 13, 1925

Smeaton – the annual show night dance will be held in the Smeaton hall tomorrow (Saturday) when the proceeds will be in aid of the supper room fund. The admission is 2/ for gentlemen and 1/ for ladies.

#### November 17, 1925

A meeting of the trustees of the Victoria Mining Accident Relief Fund will be held in Melbourne on 2<sup>nd</sup> December. Those who desire to apply for grants may obtain the necessary forms from Mr. Arthur B. Grose, town clerk.

#### November 20, 1925

The former Creswick and District Residents' Association of Geelong held a meeting under the chairmanship of its new president (Mr. A. Trott). The Secretary (Mr. A. Pavarno), read a balance sheet of the annual social reunion, which showed a credit balance.

#### November 24, 1925

The friends of ex-Cr. Richard Hender of North Creswick, will be interested to know that last Wednesday was the 83<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of his birthday. He continues in fairly good health, but is unable to get about much, having to make use of two sticks.

#### November 27, 1925

A meeting of ladies will be held this (Friday) evening, at 8.15 o'clock, in the bank chambers, to make arrangements in connection with the Creswick Hospital Sports Carnival on Foundation Day. A good attendance is hoped for.

The new building has been a centre of activity over recent weeks and it's been fantastic to watch the building take shape into its final stages. We are now of the belief that the completion date will be at the end of November with the playground areas having been completed. It is getting closer to the finish. Fingers crossed.

It has been a pleasure to welcome the 2026 Prep students through the transition program. The excitement and curiosity of newest learners remind us of the heart of what we do. The transition sessions have been filled with smiles, laughter and new friendships, as they become familiar with their teachers, classrooms and school routines. Thanks go to Ms Anderson on the program she has conducted so far. A strong start to school sets the tone for a lifetime of learning. We thank all those involved in ensuring these experiences are calm, engaging and supportive for children and families alike.
