There were 2,679 visits to eight gardens. Creswick's shops and cafes were extremely busy all weekend.

With over 60 volunteers assisting at the gardens and selling tickets at the Neighbourhood Centre Hall, it was an event which could not happen without such huge community support. The Garden Club's Monster Plant Sale was a great success. Rare plants all grown by members and sold at very realistic prices, were quickly snapped up.

The Flower Show was again held in the Creswick Neighbourhood Centre Hall. The displays enabled many people to view beautiful plants and creatively presented vases of flowers. The peonies were a big draw card this year!

Twenty eight people entered in various sections and the committee would like to see this number grow next year. Most entries were in the Floral Art, 14 in Novice and eight in the Advanced section. Greg Block judged the Floral Art with Heather Davidson taking out the blue ribbon in Advanced and a novice entry designed by Jane Neville won the blue ribbon as well as the gold ribbon for the overall Champion Exhibit in Floral Art. Well done, Jane!

The Creswick Flowers' Posy Challenge was this year judged by Kevin Moneghetti. The adult 1st prize of a \$30 voucher went to Jane Neville; 2<sup>nd</sup> place went to Carolyn Pinkowski. The junior 1st prize of a \$20 voucher was won by Esther Murray with Archie Ellis a close second.

Judging of the Horticulture sections was again done by Kevin Moneghetti. Creswick North Primary was the only school to enter the schools competition. They made a fantastic fairy garden display, thank you to all the children and teachers who took the time to enter. Hopefully the other schools can participate next year.

There were only a few entries in the children's section. The overall winner was Archer Murray, with a character made from *Anything That Grows*. Second in the under 12s was Mason Murray. Archie Ellis won with a planting in an *Unusual Container*, Max Ellis in U8 won for his character made of *Anything That Grows*. Esther and Tucker Murray were 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> and dazzled the judge with their painted glittery rocks.

# It's All About the Connection Janine Retires After 50 Years with Australia Post

Janine Booth, owner/ operator of the Creswick Post Office since 1998, celebrated a significant milestone on 1 July this year - Janine officially retired after 50 years with Australia Post.

She was born and bred in Kingston. She started with the Postmaster Generals Office (PMG) in 1974 as a Junior Postal Officer at Creswick PO delivering telegrams to make some money during school holidays. The PMG changed in 1975 to Telecom and Australia Post and Janine was lucky enough to be accepted into the

Australia Post Postal Clerk Training School in Melbourne. This was also significant as it was the first time women were included in the training intake.

Younger readers of CDN will be amused to learn that those first six women were not allowed to wear mini skirts. There were no lifts to the training floor, so no short skirts were allowed up the stairs! The trainees would spend a week on the job training at various post offices, then return for six months of study. Students were boarded out in the western suburbs and Geelong.

After graduating, Janine worked in various locations, including the Melbourne GPO, Williamstown, Newport and Sunshine Post Offices. As one of the very few females in the system, she was chosen to represent Australia Post at a number of temporary Philatelic Post Offices throughout Melbourne at significant events such as the Melbourne Show, the Melbourne Cup and the West Gate Bridge opening.

In 1979, Janine married Creswick boy, Bill Booth and transferred back to the Ballarat region, working at various post offices including Creswick, Daylesford, Maryborough, Avoca and Ballarat.

In 1992, she returned to Creswick Post Office to work for the then Licensee Ray Evans. In 1998, Janine and Bill purchased the licence from Ray, becoming the owner/operators of their home town Creswick's Licensed Post Office business, which was one of the first licensed offices in Australia.

Living and working in their home town, the Booths had two boys, Tyler and Jayden and a daughter Casey. Janine became completely enmeshed in the local community with kindergarten, school councils, the Creswick Football/Netball Club and playing and supporting junior tennis at the Mt Prospect Tennis Association at the Park Lake complex. Janine also oversaw the administration.

development and relocation of soccer and

football to the Doug Lindsay Reserve. From 2005 to 2011, Janine was an elected Councillor for Creswick Ward of the Hepburn Shire Council. Whilst there, Janine was keen to always promote Creswick's interests. In 2010 she was chosen as Mayor.

In 2012, due to her wide experience in representing Australia Post at temporary offices, Janine was accepted to work at their office at the London Olympic Games. At that time, Australia Post had garnered the support of schools Australia-wide for students to send messages of support to the Aussie athletes. This was before the days of social media and direct messaging. Most popular athletes to receive letters were the BMX riders, the equestrians and the swimmers. Whilst there, Janine would take her meals in the athletes' 4,000 seat food hall. She was very excited to see Usain Bolt there one day.

'They needed someone who could connect with school kids,' Janine tells us. When she returned from London, Janine went to various local schools to talk about her experiences and to describe how well the children's messages were received. In fact, Janine remembers clearly the bundle of letters that came to London from Creswick Primary School and was happy to tell the children there all about them.

In 2007, Janine oversaw the move into the newly renovated fire station at 81 Albert Street. The original post office building unfortunately did not comply with disability access and modern work practices. The business grew to include five mail contractors, three sorters and five counter staff, providing services to an average 400 customers a day and almost 3,000 delivery points for mail and parcels every day.

Earlier this year, Janine officially handed over the keys to the Creswick Post Office to her daughter Casey and her husband Jason Preston. With seven grandchildren and all her children living locally, Janine is looking forward to spending more time with them. She volunteers at the Visitor Information Centre and intends to join the Garden Club. She has been on the Board of the Community Bank Creswick & District for the past 18 years and has been Chair since last year. And despite having officially retired, customers may still see her at the post office helping out during busy times.

Janine looks back on her 50 year career with Australia Post with pride: 'It gave me so many opportunities and challenges. I learned so many skills from working with Australia Post, running a business and from my connection to the local community through school and sports clubs. It was a privilege to get to know and help so many in our community'.

Janine values this feeling of connectedness in Creswick very highly indeed. 'Creswick is a fantastic place to live and raise a family and I have thoroughly enjoyed being connected in a community that has supported me and my extended family through employment, education, sports and friendship.' She has been all for Creswick and its people and it's clear she intends to carry that passion on into retirement.

### Are you prepared for summer?

It is expected to be another challenging fire season and it is more important than ever to know your fire risk and prepare.

Whether your property is occupied, vacant or leased, you are responsible for:

- removing excess vegetation, rubbish and flammable materials.

- reducing fuel loads around buildings, fences, and property boundaries.
- maintaining clear access for emergency vehicles.

Make sure you have the VicEmergency app installed to stay informed on fire danger days.

### Watch out for wildlife

Snakes love warm weather and are an important part of our environment (they are a protected species under law). They normally avoid people but may bite if disturbed or threatened. All snakes should be considered venomous, dial 000 if you are bitten.

Magpies swoop on intruders when they feel they need to defend their nests and chicks. Male adults use their body language - beak clapping, whooshing above your head and screeching - to warn you to keep away from their eggs or newly-hatched chicks.



## 100 Years Ago

### Compiled by Creswick Museum

### December 1, 1925

EGG PRESERVING – Housewives and others desirous of Preserving Eggs should use only the Proved Preparation – KEEPWELL SOLUTION. Not only will it preserve a greater number, but eggs preserved by this method remain longer in better condition than those preserved by other methods.

Obtainable at W. B. Maine's Chemist, Albert Street, Creswick.

#### December 4, 1925

Allendale – the harvest has commenced on several district farms, where hay cutting is now in progress. The crops in the majority are short, but will be of good quality, as the light rainfall and cool weather has improved them much on their earlier prospects.

### December 8, 1925

Allendale St. Mary's R. C. Church. A euchre and dance in aid of the above will be held in the Allendale Mechanics' Institute on Thursday, the 10<sup>th</sup> December. Good Prizes. Good Music. Supper Provided. Prices: Euchre: 1/6. Dance: Gents, 1/-. M. Power, W. J. Casey, Hon. Secs.

### December 11, 1925

The Anzac Day Act, recently passed by the State Parliament, provides for the observance of the 25<sup>th</sup> April in each year as a public holiday. Public offices, banks, factories, shops and warehouses (with certain exceptions) must be closed, as well as hotels etc., trading in liquor on Anzac Day being prohibited. Race meetings must not be held, and no theatre of any kind (including those for pictures) used without permit from the Chief Secretary.

### December 15, 1925

A meeting of the Creswick Progress Association will be held in the bank chambers (Town hall) this (Friday) evening, at 8 o'clock, when it is specially notified that every resident of the town is entitled to be present, and it is hoped that there will be a large attendance.

### December 18, 1925

Mr. C. Steinman is now running his motor bus from Creswick to Ballarat daily, leaving at 10 am and will continue to do so until after the holidays.

### December 22, 1925

Yesterday a disastrous bush fire started in the vicinity of Lincoln Gully, to the south east of Creswick, alleged to have been started by some juveniles close to the blackberry bushes along what is known as Arch's track. It was a hot day, with a fairly strong wind blowing, and the fire spread with great rapidity.......Splendid work was done by the fire fighters, who are to be congratulated on their successful efforts. Fire breaks were burnt with the hope of confining the conflagration to a limited area, and when most of the party from Creswick left for home after five o'clock, it was believed that endeavor had been achieved, but not before several hundreds of acres of country had been burnt over.

### December 24, 1925

The residents can spend a pleasant evening at the town hall tomorrow (Christmas night), when a grand concert will be held in aid of the funds of the Creswick District Hospital. A very attractive programme has been prepared, and will be contributed to by both district and local talent. The admission is only 1/, and it is hoped that there will be a large audience to greet the performers.




