Creswick & District Historical Society

Celebrating 150 Years of Creswick Town Hall



Many locals and visitors will have seen posters and signs around town about the Creswick Town Hall celebrating 150 years since building began in 1876. In 1873, the Town Council decided to build new offices and offered £50 for a winning design. This was won by architect W.R.H. Creber of Ballarat. The builder who won the tender was A.J. Boulder at a price of £3,000. Council meetings were held in the upstairs chamber for many years and portraits of many mayors and councillors adorn the walls. The building was the centre of town activities where residents paid rates and locals enjoyed the library. The Council Chamber is one of few originals still existing.

In the 1960s there was talk of demolishing the building, but after much lobbying the council offices were opened as a museum. The main hall has been used over the years for many events and as a movie cinema when the Biobox (projector room) was added in the early 1940s.

To celebrate the 150th anniversary, the Creswick and District Historical Society in conjunction with the Creswick Museum will be open from 26 February until 1 March from 9.00am until 3.00pm each day, with displays of historic interest. Other community groups will also be involved. The Creswick Brass Band will play at 2.00pm on 28 February, the Creswick Garden Club will have a floral display to acknowledge one of the first events in the Town Hall and several other groups will have displays. Entry by donation.

The Havilah Masonic Lodge will also be open during this time and this building is unique and not to be missed.

Our First History

Six Peaks Speak: Unsettling Legacies in Southern Dja Dja Wurrung Country

Creswick and surrounds are well known for their *gold* history. But what about before the gold rush opened up the area to the world? What came before?

This is the subject of a new book by local academic and historian Professor Barry Golding AM with support from local geologist Clive Willman.

Six Peaks Speak: Unsettling Legacies in Southern Dja Dja Wurrung Country takes us on a compelling journey through the eyes of six iconic mountains in central Victoria – Mt Kooroocheang, Mt Beckworth, Mt Greenock, Mt Tarrengower, Mt Alexander and Mt Franklin. As author Bill Gammage notes in his review, Dr Golding “uses ‘unsettling’ and ‘legacies’ in striking ways to show how land and past influence present and future. It ranges from deep geological time to calls for future repair and restoration”.

The book was written as an outcome of a 2023 State Library Victoria Creative Regional Fellowship in consultation with, and the support of the Dja Dja Wurrung traditional owners. Dr Golding, a long time Kingston resident, also connected with the local community including the late Jack Sewell of Kooroocheang and the late Bernard Righetti whose family live in Hepburn’s historic *Smeaton House*. Both men had collected troves of information and retained an incredible knowledge of the history of the area. Dr Golding is deeply appreciative of being able to spend many hours with them and says their insights greatly informed the Mt Kooroocheang chapter, identifying it as a priceless cultural landscape.

Six Peaks Speak has a deep personal connection for Dr Golding. He has always felt uncomfortable living in a landscape taken by force, where what happened and how things might be reconciled today are still far from acknowledged or settled. The book is part of his attempt at reconciliation with First Peoples on Country, something he has long been passionate about.

The book is a ground up history, starting with the rocks that are such a feature of our landscape. It then takes readers on a fascinating journey, informed by detailed research, that tell us so much about each of the mountains and how the Dja Dja Wurrung peoples lived and prospered sustainably around them for tens of thousands of years.

100 Years Ago

Compiled by Creswick Museum

February 3, 1926 Hospital Sports Day – an action very much appreciated was that of several members of the now defunct brass band, who gathered together and practised, and played many selections during the currency of the sports, conducted by Mr. W. Fargher. They enlivened the proceedings, and their music was appreciated.

February 5, 1926 Blampied – The date of the Blampied Race club's meeting was recently given as 20th March. It should be 13th March. The club has joined the Bendigo District Association, and that date has been allocated to them.

February 9, 1926 At West Footscray a laborer found a gold nugget embedded in the Melbourne – Geelong Road. Gravel from Creswick had lately been used to top-dress the road, and it is surmised that the gold came from this old mining town. The sum of 13 pound 10 shillings was paid for it at a Footscray bank. It weighed a little more than 3 oz.

February 12, 1926 Dean – The continued spell of dry weather is causing a shortage of water in the district. Wells and tanks are giving out, and the potato crops need a good downpour to strengthen the tubes.

February 16, 1926 "Duck Diving" was a feature at Calembeen Park on Saturday afternoon last, when the Creswick Troup of Boy Scouts (to do their good turn) spent the afternoon in taking cut stones, broken glass, etc, from the bottom of the small swimming pool. This has certainly made bathing much more pleasant for the beginners.

February 19, 1926 Rocky Lead – A few days ago, on the 9th inst., Mr. C. C. Phillips celebrated the close of 77 years' residence in Victoria. He arrived in Geelong with his parents per the ship Labuan in 1849.

February 26, 1926 Shortly after half past eight o'clock on Wednesday night a fire broke out in the residence of Mr. V. N. James, of Reed Street, Creswick, and the house and contents were destroyed. It was a 5 roomed weatherboard building. It is stated that Mrs. James was in the bedroom, putting the children to bed, when the wind blew the curtain on to a lighted candle.

165 years ago

February 1, 1861 After the great fire, as our readers will recollect, an attempt was made to get up a Hook and Ladder Company, which would have formed the nucleus of a Creswick Fire Brigade, but the Municipal Council refused to support the embryo institution, and the consequence is that, if a fire was to break out now, we would be entirely at the mercy of the element.

150 years ago

February 2, 1876 We are requested to state that the members of the Creswick contingent of the Ballarat Troop assemble in front of the American Hotel tomorrow evening, at half past five, to proceed to Ballarat by train, when prizes are to be awarded to the best Swordsmen. Sergeant Major Price acting as judge.

75 years ago

February 2, 1951 In the event of a big fire in the district, the rural brigade's group want to be able to use Creswick fire station as a nerve centre for radio communication with men on the spot and telephone communication through the regional officer to brigades dotted for thirty miles around should they be needed.

Impact of Landscape Change on Creswick's Yarra Gums

Existing only in Victoria, Yarra gums, *Eucalyptus yarraensis*, range from the Grampians to Gippsland, and commonly occur in Ballarat and Daylesford. Why are they missing from Creswick and the region between Ballarat and Daylesford? We can still find remnants of their past existence. Bald Hills - Creswick Landcare Group is hosting a panel to explore the factors that have led to the critically endangered Yarra gums disappearing from the area, and what restoration efforts can be done to return them to Creswick and our catchment, and re-link the Daylesford and Ballarat populations.

Join the Group to hear from the panel of distinguished guests:

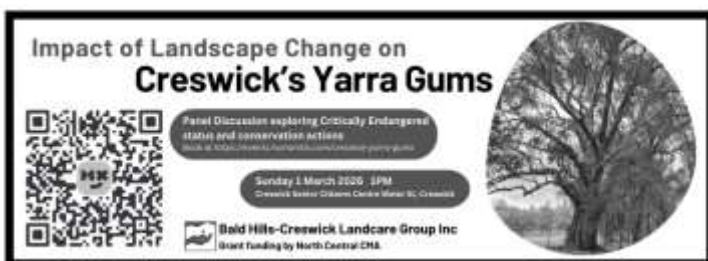
- Professor Peter Gell, Paleoecologist, Federation University
